Right-Time Training

- Right-time modules are additional themes that are no covered in the classroom training that will provide participants with tools and information they need along the journey.
- Each right-time theme is approximately 1 hour and includes: 1) Video, 2) Key points/tip sheet, 3) Discussion guide, 4) Questions and answers, 5) My story podcast and 6) Resources.
- This component of the curriculum allows participants to guide their own continued learning and obtain information at the time they need it.

Classroom/Virtual-Based Training

- The curriculum includes foundational information that is critical in effectively parenting children who have experienced trauma, separation and loss.
- The training is interactive and reflects current knowledge of adult learning. In addition to non-relative parents who want to foster and/or adopt through the child welfare system, the curriculum will also be applicable for kinship caregivers, families who adopt via the intercountry or private domestic process, and American Indian Alaska Native parents who want to foster/adopt.
- Each theme will include 'break out sections' that will help to ensure that the content in the theme is applicable to these target populations.
