Resource Parents

- Basically a foster parent
- Can support concurrent plans
- Assessment should address both paths
- Parents should be committed to reunification

Legal Risk Parents

- Basically an adoptive parent
- Assessment should address adoption and ability to navigate risk
- Would typically be approved first in adoptions (you should have a contract)
- If you don't have a contract, you will not be paid for supervision
- Transfer the home or hold it through finalization

<u>Undecided</u> Parents

- Provide information on the programs
- Listen and process their motivation and goals
- Be honest about your agency's capacity
- Be honest about our population of children, infertility issues, parent experience and capacity
- Be careful about trying out foster care as a path to adoption

Identifying & Building Capacity

- Start strong; assess continuously; change paths when appropriate
- Recruiting personalities
- Schedule capacity workshop for families; address at the re-eval
