Did you know you can keep your Georgia Families 360°SM health insurance until the last day of the month that you turn 26?

Youth ages 18-21

You may qualify for Medicaid benefits through the Chaffee Independence Program if you were in foster care on your 18th birthday.

Your DFCS case manager is responsible for changing your Medicaid to Chaffee.

Youth ages 22-26

You may qualify for Medicaid benefits through the Former Foster Care program if you were in foster care on your 18th birthday.

Your Medicaid will automatically change from Chaffee to Former Foster Care.

If you lose your Medicaid benefits, bring this booklet to your local Division of Family and Children Services (DFCS) office and apply for one of the Medicaid programs above. Make sure to let them know you were formerly a foster care youth. This will help make sure that you're added to the right program. To find an office, visit <http://dfcs.dhs.georgia.gov>.

If you qualify, you'll be automatically enrolled in Amerigroup Georgia Families 360°SM.

Care coordination

We know everyone's health is different. Our care coordinators can help you get benefits and services that work for you. Your care coordinator works for Amerigroup, not the Division of Family and Children Services (DFCS).

Your care coordinator will:

- Provide support and guidance as you transition into adulthood and become more independent
- Help you find doctors, dentists, therapists, etc.
- Remind you when it is time to get a physical or go to the dentist
- Help you find community resources, like housing and job support, education programs, and more
- Answer your questions about your plan and the benefits available to you



Benefits beyond what you expect
