Executive Order & Extension of Foster Care for Youth Ages 21+ Explained!

- O1 The Governor's Executive Order allows foster youth reaching age 21 to remain in foster care for 90 days after the order expires.
- The current order has been extended until November 9, 2020.
- Youth turning age 21 while the order is in place may remain in foster care and continue to receive services until January 9, 2021.
- Youth turning age 21 during the 90 day period after the order expires may also remain in care and receive services until February 8, 2021.
- Youth may still elect to opt-out of care on their own if they desire.
- Engage the DFCS Regional Independent Living Specialist to support the youth's transition.
