Cognitively-Based Compassion Training (CBCT)

• Based on the Cognitively-Based Compassion Training (CBCT) presentation and interest from providers, a CBCT Work Group will be formed. Runaway Protocol Update

- The Runaway Report was not presented at the meeting as the work group meeting was canceled in January due to the snow storm. It is expected that the report will be presented at the February G. Items to consider for the report:
 - Determine if youth running are repeat runners
 - I.D. where they ran and why and how long they had been in current placement
 - o I.D. previous placement type (CCI/CPA); BWO/AWO/MWO, etc.
 - Determine provider's knowledge of child's needs prior to running
- Additional providers are invited to sign up for the "40 children with Multiple Placement Moves" work group. Work group will present information at next Provider G, which should include information from the "reasons" interviews with children.

Maltreatment in Care for FFY 2010

- Data from draft report on substantiated maltreatment for FFY 2010 indicates that inadequate supervision accounts for highest number of maltreatment incidents
- A breakdown of placement types for inadequate supervision is needed
- For next Provider G:
 - Data at next G to show comparison view of FFY2010 data to previous years
 - Check Historical data for maltreatment for children with FFY 2010 incidents
 - Review seasonality of maltreatment over last several years and type of maltreatment
 - Consider the hypothesis that summer months have lower levels of maltreatment
 - Stay focused on value-based questions when analyzing data so we can reach conclusions that change outcomes
 - Determine if there are lessons that can be learned from allegations that are at lower level

Youth Aging out of Care

- Transitional Roundtables are being held.
- Providers not receiving notice about Transitional Roundtables for children in care who are ages 17 and older should notify Kristin Sanchez at Kasanchez@dhr.state.ga.us
- Prior to February Provider G, Providers need to sit in on at least one transitional roundtable and identify ways it can be improved. Ideas should be brought to February G.
- Send providers copy of policy for youth signing themselves back into care.
